Early Years Practitioner (EYP) Level 2

The Level 2 Early Years Practitioner apprenticeship is a funded work-based training programme.

EYPs work under the guidance and supervision of an Early Years Educator, teacher or other suitably qualified professional in the Early Years Workforce supporting the planning and delivery of the educational programmes for children in the 0-5 age range.

The benefits

- Learn how to support and promote children's early education and development, contribute to the planning and the organisation of activities in line with the Early Years Foundation Stage, and support the collection of accurate and up-to-date records which identify children's individual needs, abilities and progress
- Develop effective and informed practice that safeguards and promotes the health, safety and welfare of children
- The apprenticeship is levy-funded, with an employer incentive payments available
- Apprentices receive a higher level of support with monthly tutor visits and taught sessions



Early Years SENCO Level 3

The Level 3 Early Years SENCO qualification is for a level 3 practitioner in a private, voluntary or independent setting.

It is also appropriate for Ofsted-registered childminders and Ofsted-registered childminder agencies. This is an important role to ensure the best possible educational outcomes are achieved for children with special educational needs and disabilities.

The benefits

Participants learn how to:

- Learn how to identify when SEN is occurring in children with EAL
- Explain how to actively engage the child and the child's parents/carers using the Assess, Plan, Do, Review process
- Explain what an effective support plan should include and why clear outcomes are important
- Accredited and fully funded by the Department for Education, Limited places available based on DfE eligibility criteria.

National Professional Qualification in Early Years Leadership (NPQEYL)

The NPQEYL is a professional development course, which has been designed with leaders and practitioners in mind.

It is designed to support early years leaders to develop expertise in leading high-quality education and care, as well as in effective staff and organisational management.

6. School visits and 1:1

Facilitate a visit to a different school/setting to allow programme members to observe and understand expertise in context.

Who is it for?

 Suitable for someone who is or is aspiring to be a manager of a Private, Voluntary and Independent nursery, headteacher of a school-based or maintained nursery, or a childminder with leadership responsibilities

Entry requirements

- A full and approved Level 3 Early Years qualification or higher
- The qualification should have valid, reliable assessment and awarding procedures and must include an element of assessed performance evidence
- If you do not hold a full and approved Level 3
 Early Years qualification you will be asked to provide a minimum of 100 words (max 200) detailing your experience relating to Early Years, Childcare or Play work
